## Dear Supporter

This is the preliminary timetable for May 1st march for Justice for England. It may be subject to change as these things invariably are, but we will endeavour to keep everyone informed. Please check with the web site regularly. I will also send an update next month.

## The march

*Some people have expressed concern about far right groups infiltrating our rally to further their own agendas.*

*- First and foremost, this is a peaceful, non-political rally that will be supported by families, children, pensioners and the infirm. Although we would obviously like to see as many people as possible there, it must not be at the expense of the integrity of the majority.*

Arrive and gather at 10am at Whitehall Place. The march starts at 11.00am May 1st 2007.

There will be petitions at Downing Street and Palace of Westminster and a rally at the end of the march at Millbank SW1 (opposite the Tate Gallery).

There will be help for those who may find the walk difficult.

The petition at Downing Street will have St George walking from the assembly area to Downing Street Gates where he will be permitted to stand guard and await the petition party to complete their task.

The petition to the speaker at the Palace of Westminster still needs the permission of the House.

The roads need to be cleared in time for the evening rush hour. Specific route details will be announced nearer the time.

## Transport

Anyone who would like to be included in transport arrangements should keep an eye on the web site as we are trying to put in place area co-ordinators, and we will post their contact details as soon as possible. In the meantime if you would like to be kept informed of transport arrangements from your area, please email [mail@justiceforengland.com](mailto:mail@justiceforengland.com) and titled "march transport" (and put your area, ie west Lancs).

Other important points —

- \* The march is non-politically associated and therefore all placards / banners need to be sanctioned by the march organisers.
- \* The only banners / flags that do not need to be sanctioned are Cross of St George flags or Justice for England banners.
- \* If people are found carrying non-sanctioned banners or giving out non-sanctioned leaflets then the marshalls will ask them to leave the march.
- \* If that person or persons refuse then the marshalls will ask the police to remove that person / persons.
- \* Any person found causing offence will be removed from the march by the police.

**This is an event to demonstrate our anger and frustration with the way that all the people of England are treated by the British Government, we must act as English people, with respect, dignity, pride and good humour.**

This is OUR chance to show the watching world that we have had enough.
